Set-up Directions



Step 2: Make Your Bingo Cards- Cut up the "bingo choices" on page 3. Put them in a plastic bag. You'll pull these out to play bingo.

Playing Directions

Step 1: Group- Find 2-4 people who want to play your game.

Step 2: Read- Read the page about empathetic animals on page two. Discuss as a group: do you think animals can show empathy and understand how others feel?

Step 3: Pick a Caller- Pick one person who will pull the bingo cards out of the bag.

Step 4: Cards- Give everyone one of the bingo cards. The "caller" can play too.

Step 5: Start Play- Pick a bingo card out of the bag. Read the word or phrase on the card. If someone has that word or phrase, cover it up with a bingo chip. The first person to get five in a row in any direction wins.

Empathetic Animals?



Elephants

What they teach us:

Elephants travel in groups called herds. When one elephant in the herd is injured, the whole herd walks slowly. This helps the injured elephant keep up.

Why they are endangered:

Elephants are killed for their ivory tusks. Ivory is sold illegally all over the world. It's used to make crafts and other objects.



Dolphins

What they teach us.

Dolphins live in groups called pods. They work together as a group to solve problems. When a dolphin in the pod dies, the dolphins seem to get upset. Dolphins also swim side by side and pat each other with their fins. It almost looks like they are comforting each other when they are sad.

Why they are endangered:

Dolphins can live in rivers and oceans. Many dolphins are endangered. They are endangered mostly because they get caught in fishing nets or their homes (like rivers) are polluted.



Gorillas

What they teach us.

Gorillas live in groups called troops. Many live in the forest or jungle. Sometimes people set traps for smaller animals in the jungle. These traps are called snares. These traps are usually too small to catch gorillas. Scientists have seen gorillas destroy these traps. They wonder if that means gorillas are trying to protect other animals.



Gorillas are threatened by wars, destruction of their forests, and by poaching.



Whales

What they teach us.

Humpback whales live alone or in small groups of 2-3 whales. These groups are called pods. Humpbacks communicate with song. Humbacks seem to defend other animals. Killer whales attack seals. Scientists have seen humpback whales fight killer whales to save seals. Is this empathy? Some people believe that this shows humpback whales help to protect small ocean animals from attack.

Why they are endangered:

Humpback whales live all over the world in 14 giant groups. Four of those groups are endangered. Their biggest threats are fishing and being struck by large boats.
