


A.3 Graph the Impact

Directions: It's time to show how Burmese pythons have harmed the Everglades. This graph will show what percent of the animals they have eaten. If a python has eaten 99% of racoons, that means they've eaten 99 out of every 100 raccoons. That's a lot of raccoons! Find each animal on the "Animals of Florida" image in lesson 3.9. Find out what percent pythons have eaten. Then draw a bar showing that percent.

A.3 Origami Native Species

Directions: Now you will show how one native species in the Everglades has been impacted by the Burmese python. You will pick one animal the Burmese python eats and make an origami model of that animal. Then you'll write a bit about how that animal has been impacted. If you want to make a minimuseum, you can make more than one model and display them where others will be able to see them and learn about the native species.


- Step 1: Gather your materials.
- Step 2: Pick a species: fox, bobcat or rabbit. The fox is most challenging.
- Step 3: Cut your paper to make a square if you do not have origami paper.
- Step 4: Follow the directions on the next five pages to pick and make your model.
- **Step 5:** Fill out your display mat and write about how native species has been impacted by the Burmese python. This will teach others about your species.

Pro Tip:


Don't worry if you do not have origami paper. You can use any paper as long as it is square. Follow the steps below to make a rectangle piece of paper into a square.



Step 1: fold corner to side to make a triangle



Step 2: cut off extra paper



Step 3: unfold your paper
