

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
## **1.1 Fact Finder Notes**

#### Why and how was plastic invented?




## 2.2 Can Acts of Kinship Help with Plastic?

#### **Remember:**


- A random act of kindness is when you do something kind for someone else when they are not expecting it.

- Make a chalk art message, hopscotch, or game on the sidewalk for your neighbors to enjoy.


#### Who will you perform your random act of kindness for? Why did you choose this person?
