
Your mission is to collect information that will help you with your final project. Every time you watch a video, read a text, or do an activity, you should write down new information that you think will help you with your project.

What can individuals do to stay safe during natural disasters?




What are some design solutions that can reduce the effects of natural disasters?

Why else are you interested in learning about wild weather and natural disasters?






Directions: It's time to write your own dictionary definition for the meaning of kinship. You will be using this throughout this project.

Draw a picture to show the meaning of kinship.


Write a definition for kinship in your own words.



2.3 Kinship Timeline



3.4 Natural Disaster Map

Directions: Now you will make a map that shows where you live, and illustrates what natural disasters may occur in your area. This will help you understand how Earth's features influence natural disasters. You can use your map to teach others about natural disasters, and for your Take Action Project.

Materials



Directions:

- Step 1: Gather your materials.
- **Step 2**: Use the map to draw where you live. Leave enough space on your poster (between one-third to half of your poster board), to include a written explanation. You will add this in at the end.
- Step 3: Label all map features, including landforms and bodies of water. Include at least five features.
- **Step 4:** Create an information pop-out that includes: 1) where you live 2) what features are where you live 3) how these features make certain natural disasters likely to occur where you live.
- Step 5: Color your map and decorate it how you like.
