

2.3: Where's the Line

In ethics, we talk about a "red line." It's a line you do not cross.

For example, you might say I will help my friend study, but I won't help them cheat. Cheating is your red line.

But maybe you say, I will help my friend cheat on homework, but not a test. Cheating on a test is your red line.

Directions: Look at the list below. Where would you draw your red line? Why?

Create a post that spreads a rumor you heard, even though you're not sure it's true.
